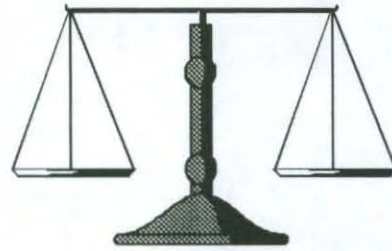

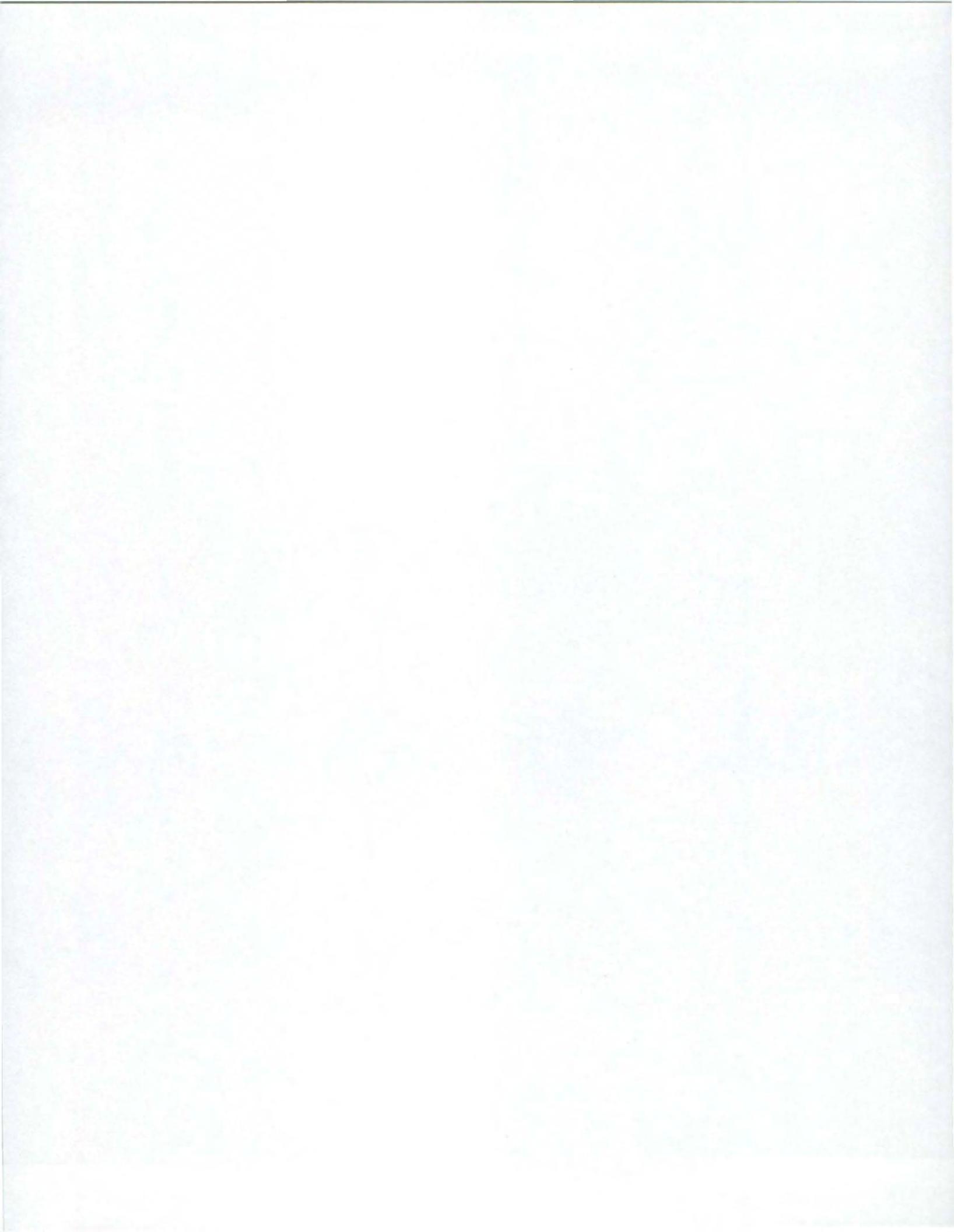

Preface

This investigation was written back and forth, to myself, over a number of years while I was teaching Philosophy and Humanities at Oklahoma State University. The manuscript can be seen as a kind of "laboratory record" of thought. It includes all working notes, cross references, indexes, and work-sheets.
